- JPEG format; at least 3 MB or 300 DPI

## JUROR BIOS

**Becky Carr** is a retired middle school teacher who moved to Roanoke in 2007 and began taking pottery classes the same year. She was drawn immediately to the art of hand-building using coils and slabs of clay. Much of her work centers around creating artistic architectural forms by putting together geometric shapes of clay. She has a small home studio and teaches hand-building classes at Studio 228 in Vinton.

**Bryce Cobbs** is an artist born and raised in Roanoke, Virginia. He studied Communication Arts at Virginia Commonwealth University before returning home to work professionally as a freelancer. He works in a variety of 2D materials and his subject matter always reflects the beauty of black culture and the narrative aspects he wishes to convey through the black experience.

**Maggie Perrin-Key** is an artist and muralist based in Roanoke, Virginia. She received her B.A. in Studio Art from Hollins University in 2017, and has been showing her work regionally in group and solo exhibitions since her graduation.

## ELIGIBILITY

Open to Roanoke residents of all ages and all 2D media.

## ENTRY PROCEDURES

The competition will be juried from digital images. One image per work is permitted. Each digital image must be identified with corresponding artist's name.

The art director will digitally add the Roanoker masthead to entries that meet all requirements. The color of the masthead will be chosen at the discretion of the art director.

Original artwork may be larger than 8.25 x 10.875" as long as it is scaled up proportionally. Otherwise, the artwork image will be cropped as needed to fit the magazine cover dimensions.

## JUDGING

All entries will be juried by digital image and selections will be made by the jurors and the art director. Award winners will be selected by the jurors after the exhibition is installed.

## CASH AWARDS

Awards will be given at the discretion of the jurors.

Categories include:

- Most Innovative Work
- Best Use of Color
- Best Depiction of an Outdoor Setting
- Best Downtown/Town Center Depiction
- Best Depiction of Community Spirit
- Best Depiction of a Community Member
- Best Depiction of a Beloved Landmark
- Best Recreation of a Past Cover

## PURCHASES

Prints will not be for sale, but viewers interested in purchasing original artwork can contact the art director to be connected with the artist.

## ACCEPTED WORK

The exhibition will consist of high quality digital reproductions of each selected work. Artists are not required to deliver original artwork.

Entry in the exhibition constitutes agreement to the conditions set forth in this prospectus.
